



Fun fact: All the coloring plates in this book are drawn from real salamanders that were observed in the wild.












Coastal Giant Salamander (Dicamptodon tenebrosus)






Fun fact: Oregon Slender Salamander looks like a worm because of its thin body, reddish color, and small legs.











Fun fact: Northern Slimy Salamander gets its name from the slimy, glue-like secretions it produces when threatened.






Fun fact: The Cascade Torrent Salamander is only found in the Cascade Mountain range which the salamander is named after. It lives in small, mountain streams.
